The Clerk formally advised the Assembly that Mr. Speaker was unavoidably absent and called upon the Deputy Speaker to take the Chair pursuant to the Statutes. The Deputy Speaker took the Chair at 10:00 a.m.

By unanimous consent, it was agreed that the Private Member's Resolution to be considered today will be the resolution sponsored by the Member for Brandon West and that the resolution sponsored by the Member for The Pas will be considered on Tuesday, May 25, 2010.

By unanimous consent, it was agreed to consider second reading of Bills 223, 225 and 228 on Thursday, May 20 at 11:00 a.m. instead of a Private Member's Resolution.

By leave, it was agreed for the House to deal with Second Reading of Bill (No. 220).

Hon. Mr. GERRARD moved:

THAT Bill (No. 220) – The Health Care Accountability Act (Health Services Act and Health Services Insurance Act Amended)/Loi sur l'obligation redditionnelle en matière de soins de santé (modification de la Loi sur les services de santé et de la Loi sur l'assurance-maladie), be now read a Second Time and be referred to a Committee of this House.

Resolution No. 10: BiPole III: Keeping Routing Options on the Table

WHEREAS Manitoba Hydro requires a third BiPole high voltage direct current transmission line (BiPole III) to transmit hydroelectric power from northern generating stations to southern Manitoba; and

WHEREAS Manitoba Hydro is proceeding with a western route; and

WHEREAS there are other options that should remain on the table; and

WHEREAS an eastern route would be cheaper, provide economic opportunities for east side residents, and have a smaller environmental footprint.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Provincial Government to allow Manitoba Hydro to consider an east side BiPole III line as a viable alternative to a west side route.

Mr. EICHLER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Conservation to consider immediately placing the recent changes to the Onsite Wastewater Management System (OWMS) Regulation under *The Environment Act* on hold until such time that a review can take place to ensure that they are based on sound science and to consider implementing the prohibition on wastewater ejector systems on a case-by-case basis as determined by environmental need in ecologically sensitive areas and to consider offering financial incentives to help affected Manitoba property owners adapt to these regulatory changes. Mrs. DRIEDGER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Provincial Government consider immediately providing Revlimid as a choice to patients with Multiple Myeloma and their health care providers in Manitoba through public funding. (R. Erasiuk, I. Doll, G. Doll and others)

Mr. BRIESE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the appropriate ministers of the Provincial Government to consider outlining to Parks Canada the importance that a viable recreational facility in the Mount Agassiz area would play in the local and provincial economies and to consider working with all stakeholders, including Parks Canada, to help develop a plan for a viable, multi-season recreation facility in the Mount Agassiz area.
