THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

**THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF
HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION:
The "Licencee"**

for the construction of the Development being the upgrading of Provincial Road #332 beginning at the UVD of Rosenfeld and extending in a southerly direction a distance of 18.2 kilometers to PTH #23 subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS


1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the *Environment Act Proposal - Proposed Upgrading Of: Provincial Road #332 (from the Village of Rosenfeld to PTH #23)*, dated September 1993.
2. The Licencee shall, during the design and construction of the drainage structures associated with the Development adhere to the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources' guidelines titled *Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba*.
3. The Licencee shall, prior to disposing any vegetation debris left from the clearing of the highway right-of-way, reach an agreement with the Regional Environment Officer on the method of disposal.
4. The Licencee shall collect and dispose of all waste oil products including hydraulic fluids, etc. generated by the machinery used in the construction of the Development in accordance with applicable Manitoba Environment and legislation requirements.
5. The Licencee shall, during construction, comply with all requirements of *Manitoba Regulation 97/88R* respecting *Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products*.

6. The Licencee shall, upon completion of construction, cleanup and deposit all non-hazardous waste and debris from the construction activities at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to MR 150/91 respecting Waste Disposal Grounds.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
