A Dangerous Goods Handling & Transportation Act application has been filed by The City of Winnipeg for the continued operation of a Waste Battery Transfer Depot located at 1901 Brady Road, Winnipeg. The Waste Battery Transfer Depot will accept waste lead acid batteries, store them temporarily and then transport them to a licensed battery receiver/recycler.
