Coues notes that in David Thompson's Journal, there is a loose leaf page called "Journey to West End of [Little] Slave Lake" dated Nov. 5-9, 1802. It describes a journey from the head of Little Slave River to the other end of the lake, where the North West Co. House is at Latitude 55 32' 36" N. He finds three men there: Mr. Jarvis, Tom Grey, and Le Ramme.
