**THRONE SPEECH PROCEDURE OF THE SECOND SESSION OF THE
THIRTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATURE ON DECEMBER 5, 2000**

1. The Premier, Military and Civil Aides, and Officers comprising the Officer Escort meet in the Lieutenant Governor's reception room.
2. **All Members of the Legislative Assembly and invited guests** enter the Chamber through the North doors, proceed to their seats and remain standing.
3. At 1:30 p.m. the Sergeant-at-Arms, carrying the Mace shoulder high, followed by the Speaker, the Clerk, the Deputy Clerk and the Clerk Assistants enters the Chamber through the North doors, proceeds along the West side of the Chamber, crosses in front of the Throne to the East side and returns to the main entrance of the Chamber where he remains standing facing the North doors, and awaits the arrival of the Lieutenant Governor.

The Speaker following the Sergeant-at-Arms proceeds along the West side of the Chamber, crosses in front of the Throne to the East side, takes post in front of the first desk and remains standing.

The Clerks following the Speaker proceed along the West side of the Chamber, take post in front of the first three front row desks and remain standing.

4. The Premier, Military and Civil Aides and Officer Escort accompany His Honour, the Lieutenant Governor from the reception room to the Chamber in the following order:

The Civil Aide on the right
The Military Aide on the left
The Officer Escort
The Premier
The Lieutenant Governor.

5. At the main entrance, the Military and Civil Aides, the Officer Escort halt and turn inwards to allow the Lieutenant Governor and the Premier to advance to the head of the Officer Escort, where His Honour, the Lieutenant Governor is met by the Sergeant-at-Arms carrying the Mace shoulder high.

The Lieutenant Governor then, preceded by the Sergeant-at-Arms and followed on his left by the Military Aide, and on his right by the Civil Aide, proceeds along the West side of the Chamber to the Throne.

The Premier proceeds along the East side of the Chamber, takes post in front of the desk on the Speaker's right and remains standing.

The Military Aide takes his position on the East side of the Throne, the Civil Aide takes her position on the West side of the Chamber and the Officer Escort is positioned on the West side of the Throne and remain standing.

6. The Lieutenant Governor is seated on the Throne. The Sergeant-at-Arms makes obeisance with the Mace and retires to the East side of the Chamber immediately to the left of the Speaker.

7. The Civil Aide advances from the position she has taken on the West side of the Chamber and, after the usual obeisance on each step, hands the Lieutenant Governor the Speech from the Throne.

The Civil Aide then retires, step by step, and takes her position on the West side of the Chamber.

8. Before the Lieutenant Governor reads the Speech from the Throne, he will say "**PLEASE BE SEATED**".

All are seated except for the Sergeant-at-Arms, Officer Escort and the Military and Civil Aides.

9. After completion of the Throne Speech, the Lieutenant Governor will rise from the Throne to retire. **ALL MEMBERS AND GUESTS STANDING.**

The Sergeant-at-Arms makes obeisance with the Mace and precedes the Lieutenant Governor accompanied by the Premier, the Officer Escort and the Aides along the East side of the Chamber to the North doors. The Lieutenant Governor and party exit.

The **Sergeant-at-Arms** remains at the North doors facing the Throne.

10. The Speaker proceeds from the East side of the Chamber to the Throne and remains standing.

The Premier proceeds from the North doors to his assigned seat in the Chamber and remains standing.

The Sergeant-at-Arms proceeds along the West side of the Chamber to stand in front of the Speaker, makes obeisance with the Mace, returns to his chair at the Clerk's Table, lays the Mace on the Table and remains standing.

The Clerks take their places at the Table and remain standing.

11. The Speaker reads the Prayer.

12. The Speaker bows to the Members and says "**PLEASE BE SEATED**".

13. The Premier moves:

"THAT leave be given to introduce a Bill (No. 1) – An Act respecting the Administration of Oaths of Office/Loi sur la prestation des serments d'entrée en fonction, and that the same be now received and read a First Time."

14. The Speaker then informs the House that:

15. The Premier moves:

"THAT the Speech of His Honour, the Lieutenant Governor be taken into consideration tomorrow."

16. The Premier moves:

"THAT this House do now adjourn."

17. **ALL MEMBERS AND GUESTS STANDING.**

The Speaker, preceded by the Sergeant-at-Arms and followed by the Clerks of the Legislative Assembly, proceeds along the East side of the Chamber and exits through the North doors.
